### 2014 SPORTS FIELD TOUR


**OREGON SCHOOL DISTRICT**





### WINTER CONFERENCE RECAP

Although Mother Nature decided to throw us a curveball in February that caused some last minute re-scheduling, the 2014 Wisconsin Sports Turf Managers Association Winter Conference was worth the wait! The predicted super storm never quite lived up to the hype in most parts of the state, but the board felt that the safety of our members, vendors and guest speakers traveling to attend the conference was important enough to warrant rescheduling the event.

The Conference was finally held at the beautiful banquet facilities of the Fox Cities Stadium, home of the Wisconsin Timber Rattlers on Tuesday March 18th. Many thanks go out to the staff at Fox Cities Stadium and all of our vendors and speakers who were all extremely accommodating throughout the rescheduling process.

Once again this year the WSTMA was able to partner with the UW-Extension Pesticide Applicator Training Program and the Wisconsin Department of Ag, Trade and Consumer Protection to offer a review session and the opportunity to take the Turf and Landscape Category 3.0 pesticide certification exam at the conference as an alternative morning session track. We hope to be able to continue to offer this opportunity each year at the Winter Conference so keep this in mind if you or any of your staff need to take the test next year.

To start off our morning session Dr. Doug Soldat provided a report from the UW-Madison OJ Noer Turfgrass Research and Education Facility. Doug provided an update on current staffing, funding, trials and research happening at the facility. Doug shared details and results from some trials and research of particular interest to sports turf managers. Dr. Soldat shared his observations of drought damage throughout the state over the past two summers and how those observations align with ongoing research at the OJ Noer Facility on various turfgrass species in different fertility conditions. He also walked the group through the USGS Web Soil Survey website, providing an overview of how to navigate the site and how the site can be a resource for sports turf managers.

To wrap up the morning session we heard from Matt Cavanaugh from PBI Gordon Corporation with an overview of herbicides most relevant to sports turf managers, who are often limited

by re-seeding intervals. Matt's presentation began with a review of the important differences in the life cycle of perennial weeds, winter annuals and summer annuals. Matt also reviewed the differences between ester and amine herbicide formulations before moving into a discussion of specific herbicide recommendations for common sports turf problem situations.

After a wonderful lunch prepared by the Fox Cities Stadium catering staff, Michael Boettcher, Director



of Grounds for the Milwaukee Brewers presented a discussion of "Managing and Molding Tomorrow's Field Managers Today." Michael asked each of us to reflect on the kind of manager we are and the kind of impact we have on all those we manage. Michael shared his experiences as he started as intern himself to being a mentor and providing internship opportunities for others today. It was interesting to see the number of conference attendees who can list an internship with Michael and the Brewers on their resume. Michael also shared with us examples of those who mentored and positively influenced him in his career and asked us to reflect on those people who have mentored and influenced each of us in our careers. Michael asked each of us to consider how we are helping develop the sports turf managers of tomorrow, whether that means offering internships, student





#### WSTMA PROVIDES EDUCATION OPPORTUNITIES

One of the main goals of the Wisconsin Sports Turf Managers Association is to promote and provide educational opportunities for our members. Many members may not realize that additional education is available from a number of resources close to their homes.

The Wisconsin Technical College System is comprised of 16 colleges, located at numerous facilities across the State of Wisconsin. Many, but not all, of these campuses offer continuing education opportunities for our members. The programs can range from an associate degree, to a technical college degree, to a certificate, or, just single classes. Teachers in the technical college system must not only have achieved their academic degrees, but must have years of experience in the field in order to be hired to teach at a technical college. This ensures that there is academic knowledge plus practical experience in the field.

A number of the technical colleges offer a class entitled Turfgrass Management, or a similar title to their class. After researching the websites 12 colleges offer such a class. These colleges include: Western Technical College in La Crosse, Southwest

Technical College in Fennimore, Blackhawk Technical College in Janesville, Chippewa Valley Technical College in Eau Claire, Fox Valley Technical College in Appleton, Lakeshore Technical College in Cleveland/Sheboygan, Madison Area Technical College in Madison, Mid-State Technical College in Wisconsin Rapids, Milwaukee Area Technical College in Milwaukee, Northeast Wisconsin Technical College in Green Bay, and Southwest Technical College in Fennimore.


Each college also offers a large array of courses that may be of interest to our members. Some of these courses include: Horticulture Soils, Identification of Woody Trees and Shrubs, Survey of Herbaceous Plants, Plant Health Care (including the Pesticide Applicator Training within this course), Irrigation installation and maintenance, Landscape Maintenance, and Landscape Design courses. Every college has a different selection of courses, so it is best to check all your options and have a conversation with one of the teaching staff.

Another terrific resource for education is the national SportsTurf Managers Association website. Anyone can go to the STMA website and select the 'Knowledge' button. Under this button are a variety of resources to explore, thirteen topics in all. Some of the topics that I have investigated include; Turfgrass, Environmental Stewardship, Cultural Practices, and Continuing Education. I enjoy the opportunity to review presentations made at the 2011, 2012, and 2013 national meetings. There are well over 100 presentations at your fingertips!

Another topic located under the 'Knowledge' button is the University Publications topics. Here you will find listing of over 100 articles, neatly classified under general topics such as Soil Testing, Watering, Maintenance Calendars, Construction/ Establishment/Renovation. Weeds, Diseases, Insects, and Calculations and Calibrations. There is no reason to reinvent the wheel, utilize this great resource of information. Many times the information will include something new, but at other times it is valuable to not learn anything new and to reinforce that you are following the best possible procedures.

Expand your knowledge of sports turf management by utilizing all these resources.  $\diamond$
